YEAR 5/6 CANBERRA CAMP

The year 5/6 Canberra camp is on **Monday 27th October to Friday 31st October**. The cost of the camp is \$850.00. A Compass event has been published with the option to pay in 4 instalments The second instatement is due <u>Friday 2nd May</u> 2025.

If you wish to use your SSB funds, you must first log into your portal and allocate the nominated amount to 'school activities'. You must then ring or email the office to advise that you wish to use these funds for the camp. It may be easier for you to forward your confirmation from the SSB portal that you have allocated the funds to the School email. In this email you can also confirm that you wish for the full amount to be used for camp. If you wish to use another sibling's SSB to go towards your year 5/6 student's camp funds, please also advise by email. Please note that this can only be done for SSB funds NOT for CSEF funds.

COMPASS APP - PARENTS PORTAL - ABSENCES

If your child is absent, you can log this through your Compass app. Please note this is the preferred way to log student absences. Please do not email or message the teachers as they do not always have time to read messages in the morning.
